The terms are as follows:

Class A - Shortwave (20 points on at least 2 bands)

- One station from HB (Switzerland) must be worked 3 Points
- Clubstation OE5XLM 5 Points
- YL-Stations from OE 5 Points
- Any other station from OE5 1 Point

Stations with the ADL 505 count double.

All modes are allowed.

Any station may be worked on each band once only.

Class B – VHF / UHF (20 points)

- All stations must be members of ADL505 1 Point
- One YL- Station 2 Points
- Clubstation OE5XLM 5 Points
- One station from HB, Switzerland (only one counts) 3 Points

All modes are allowed.

Any station may be worked on each band once only.

Provisions for Class A and B

These provisions apply to SWL's too.

All radio contacts after the 1st January 1984 are counting among.

Henry Dunant Award

Certainly one of the most interesting biography in the history of the Red Cross Organization is the one of the founder, Mr. Henry Dunant. It started in Geneva, where Dunant was born on May 8th, 1828. Based on his religious conviction, the young Henry Dunant stands up for humanity. This engagement appears in joining the Geneva association for almsgiving. But Mr. Dunant wants more. He fulfilled his dream of a worldwide spiritual family with the foundation of the association "Christian young men" in 1855.

The crucial experience of his life happened to Dunant at a business trip to Solferino in northern Italy at 1859. Rather accidentally he was witness of one of the most bloody battles in history. A battle with over 40.000 injured and dead humans. Shocked by the adversity of the victims and the helplessness of the aidman the thought of an international aid organization crossed his mind from now on.

Soon he was completing his life's dream.

His memorandum „In Memoriam of Solferino“ advised the heads of state of his idea. So the international commission of the Red Cross could be founded in 1863. Only one year later the first Geneva Convention was enacted. But Henry Dunant couldn't enjoy the fruits of his work for a long time. After the conviction due to bogus bankruptcy he lived as a homeless person for many years. Nevertheless he never stopped his activity.

His rediscovery in 1895 brought him the hard earned fame which culminated in the award of the Nobel Prize in 1901.

Henry Dunant deceased on October 30th, 1910.

This award was created for acceptance and appreciation for the great merits of the founder of the Red Cross Organization, Mr. Henry Dunant. Included in this acceptance are all persons who are working in the worldwide Red Cross Organization and act on behalf of the mind of Mr. Henry Dunant.
